THE FEDERATED GOVERNING BODY OF THE NETHERHALL LEARNING CAMPUS

- 1. The name of the Federation is **Netherhall Learning Campus**
- 2. The names and categories of the Schools in the Federation are:

Netherhall Learning Campus High School
Netherhall Learning Campus Junior School
Netherhall St James C of E (VC) Infant and Nursery School
Church of England

- 3. The name of the governing body is **The Federated Governing Body of the Netherhall Learning Campus**.
- 4. The governing body shall consist of:-
 - (a) 2 parent governors
 - (b) 1 LA
 - (c) 1 Head Teacher
 - (c) 1 staff
 - (d) 7 co-opted governors
 - (e) **2** foundation governors (including any governors referred to in paragraph 6 and 7 below)
- 5. Total number of governors is 14
- 6. 1 foundation governor appointed by the Leeds Diocesan Board of Education after consultation with the Parochial Church Council for Rawthorpe St James.
- 7. (a) The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex- officio:
 - The Priest in Charge of Rawthorpe St James.
 - (b) The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry within which the Federation is situated shall appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex-officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that the ex-officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or has been removed from office under regulation 21 (1) of the School Governance (Constitution) (England) 2012 Regulations, or there is a vacancy in the office by virtue of which his governorship exists.

- 8. (a) Any foundation Governor other than an ex officio foundation governor may be removed from office by the body which appointed the foundation governor.
 - (b) Any governor so removed and the Clerk to the Governing Body, shall be notified in writing by the body referred to in 8 (a).
- 9. Ethos Statement which will apply to Netherhall St James C of E (VC) Infant and Nursery School

Recognising its historic foundation, the School will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan level.

The School aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils.

- 10. This instrument of government comes into effect on 10 August 2020.
- 11. This instrument was made by the Kirklees Federation (Instrument of Government) No.1 Order 2015 and amended by the Kirklees Federated Schools (Instrument of Government) (Amendment) Order No 2 2020 and Kirklees Federated Schools (Instrument of Government) (Amendment) Order No 4 2020.
- 12. A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and the head teacher if not a governor), any trustees and to the appropriate religious body.
